4 incarnate expression of God's commitment to God's beloved creation; and

- 6 WHEREAS, we believe it is God's will, testified to in the Old Testament prophetic tradition and
7 incarnated in the life and ministry of Jesus, that all people should experience
8 wholeness of body, mind, and spirit; and

- 10 WHEREAS, Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI) has served people in need in Illinois for
11 more than 140 years and continues to serve people in need regardless of race,
12 creed, ethnicity, etc.; and

- 14 WHEREAS, LSSI is the only statewide ELCA social ministry organization in Illinois; and

- 16 WHEREAS, LSSI, like most other human care provider organizations in Illinois, has suffered from
17 chronic under-funding of state-funded services; therefore, be it

- 19 RESOLVED, by the 2008 Assembly of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod, that the fourth Sunday of
20 Easter be designated as Good Shepherd/LSSI Sunday in every congregation in this
21 synod beginning in 2009 and that congregations are encouraged to make use of
22 resources provided by LSSI to lift up our common ministry through LSSI; and be it

26 communicate to their elected officials their support for increased funding for human
27 care services.
