## February TSI Update

### Focus Congregations and Coaching Training Underway

Eleven congregations are going forward as the first round of Focus Congregations in the Turnaround Synod Initiative. They are: St. James, Western Springs; Ascension, Northfield; Savior Divine, Palos Hills; Northlake, Northlake; Church of the Master, Carol Stream; Lebanon, Chicago; Calvary (on Kenneth), Chicago; Living Lord, Bartlett; Redeemer, Oak Forest; Trinity, Des Plaines; and St. Philip, Glenview.

These congregations got underway in January with workshops for pastors and renewal teams. Pastors gathered on January 15 and renewal teams on January 30 to reflect together on how renewal happens in churches and on aspects of leading change and leading in times of change.

Please consider adding one or more of these Focus Congregations to your personal and congregational prayer list, asking that the Spirit would be present to encourage, guide, and support them as they work toward renewal.

Also in January, ten people from the synod spent two full days doing a coaching orientation and training led by Jonathan Reitz (then Coaching Coordinator for the ELCA, now CEO of Coachnet International Ministries. After doing six months of coaching with the guidance of a mentor, they will be prepared to work with renewal teams in congregations to help those congregations find and follow a renewal path.

## Take the ELCA Health Assessment and Receive \$150 to Help with Medical Expenses



The ELCA health plan contribution rate increase for sponsored members is being held to 2% in 2010 — partly a result of the improving health of plan members.

According to the Board of Pensions, it's seeing favorable early signs that pastors, rostered leaders, and lay employees are adopting healthy behaviors. Since the 2008 transition of the ELCA Health Benefits Plan to a wellness plan:

- Potentially avoidable medical and pharmacy claims are down 3 percent from December 2007 to December 2008, bringing an estimated annual savings of \$3 million
- Two out of three plan members participating in Mayo Clinic's lifestyle coaching program (a wellness plan feature) said they have been able to maintain their healthy behaviors six months after coaching ended
- Of the more than 8,300 ELCA-primary plan members who completed the Mayo Clinic Health Assessment in both in 2008 and 2009, the reported percentage of participants at risk for specific medical and lifestyle conditions decreased in 10 of the 11 risk factors this year.

- do your part to keep health care costs down and leave more money for ELCA mission.

The Fund for Mission is a synod endowment fund that provides grants to congregations for new and innovative evangelism efforts. Last year, grants totaling \$139,200 were distributed to 15 congregations. Grants ranged from \$2000 to \$20,000.

## Apply for an Accessible Faith Grant



The Retirement Research Foundation announces continuation of funding through its Accessible Faith Grant Program to enable Chicago area houses of worship to make their facilities more accessible.

With such improvements, older adults and people with disabilities may be able to participate more fully in the programs, services, and activities of the facilities.

Houses of worship in Cook, Lake, or DuPage Counties in Illinois are eligible to apply for a grant.

Grants may be awarded for up to 50% of a project's total cost, for a maximum of \$30,000. Houses of worship may use an Accessible Faith Grant for:

- design and construction of accessibility improvements such as elevators, platform lifts, permanent ramps, or restroom renovations, and
- purchase and installation of program-related equipment such as assistive listening systems

Deadlines for applying are April 16, 2010, and June 25, 2010. Grant award notifications will be shared approximately five months after each deadline, with funding available one month after notification.

### LSSI's Bitner, Schwick Named to State Commissions on Human Services, Elimination of Poverty

The Rev. Dr. Denver Bitner and the Rev. Daniel Schwick of Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI) were each recently named to serve on a state commission. Bitner, president of LSSI, was named to the Illinois Human Services Commission by Governor Pat Quinn. Schwick, director of church and government relations, was named by House Speaker Michael Madigan to serve on the Illinois Commission on the Elimination of Poverty. Based in Des Plaines, LSSI is a statewide, not-for-profit social service agency of the three Illinois synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The new Human Services Commission, formed last November, will make recommendations to the governor and General Assembly about improving the delivery of high-quality human services to Illinois citizens. It will address issues such as “the process for determining fair, adequate and timely reimbursement; efficient management of publicly funded programs and services; and projects for future human services need in Illinois.” Its first meeting was January 20, 2010.

The goal of the Illinois Commission on the Elimination of Poverty is to come up with ways to cut the number of Illinoisans living in extreme poverty by 50 percent by 2015.
